



Green Travel in the Erasmus+ Programme

Student mobility

The **financial support for sustainable transport** aims at increasing the number of mobilities with more environmentally friendly means of transport and reducing the environmental footprint of the Erasmus+ Programme.

Definition of Green Travel

Green travel is travel that uses low-emission means of transport such as **buses, trains or carpools** for the majority of the journey.

Who is entitled to the top-up for Green Travel?

All students are eligible who complete a mobility in an Erasmus+ programme country and who are entitled to funding for individual support (without travel cost support) according to the programme specifications. This includes all students of the TH Rosenheim who apply for a semester abroad at an Erasmus+ partner university of their own faculty or for funding of an internship abroad via Erasmus+, or for funding of a short-term blended mobility via Erasmus+.

What does the top-up for Green Travel include?

A higher travel allowance plus funding of up to six additional travel days, if applicable.

What do I have to consider for this?

In order for us to be able to support you with the top-up, you must be able to prove that you have travelled sustainably. Please keep your receipts for the outward and/or return journey from your destination country. The dates of arrival and/or departure should, of course, be in a realistic relationship to the actual length of stay abroad. Carpools must have their journey confirmed by their partner and also submit fuel receipts and, if applicable, receipts for the purchase of vignettes etc.



Proof of green travel:

Keep your receipts for arrival and/or departure. Hand in a scan or photo of them together with the application form for green travel after your stay abroad.

Train / Bus:

Please note that the date of arrival and/or return must correspond approximately to the beginning/end date of your stay abroad. A receipt is sufficient.

Carpool:

Have your co-drivers sign your ride on the application form for green travel (declaration of honour). In principle, anyone can be a co-driver. If you ride together with your fellow students, each of you may apply for the green travel top-up.

In this case, please complete the applications separately for each person.

In addition to the signature on your application form for green travel, however, we also need a receipt for the means of travel.

For this purpose, you can submit the proof of purchase for the country's vignette, a fuel receipt from abroad or comparable proof showing the approximate date of travel.

Additional travel days:

Participants are entitled to up to six additional travel days, provided they travel sustainably. The number of additional travel days is then determined based on the distance between Rosenheim and the location of the stay abroad as follows:

- at least 1,000 km: 1 additional travel day
- at least 2,000 km: 2 additional travel days
- at least 3,000 km: 3 additional travel days

The kilometres travelled sustainably for the outward and return journeys will be added up. The distance is calculated using the Erasmus+ distance calculator.

A maximum of six additional travel days will be paid out, whereby a maximum of three additional travel days can be funded for the outward and return journey, respectively.
